

MINISTRY EXPECTATIONS

How do I become a member of the Facilities Commission? An interest in the commission can be indicated on the Stewardship of Talent card; or you may contact the parish office or the ministry leader, directly.

What defines an "active" member of the Commission? Attendance at the monthly meetings (Sept.—June) and participating in our scheduled work parties.

How do I end my membership in the Commission? Notify the committee leader or the parish office that you are no longer interested in being a member.

Is the attire of the member important? No.

What special talents/characteristics are desired in a member of the Commission? People with mechanical inclinations enjoy this ministry, experience in construction is a plus.

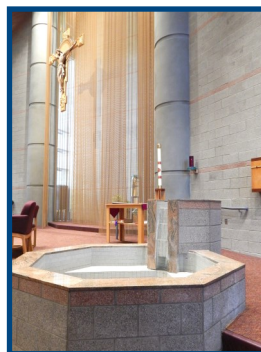
What is the time commitment? 1-2 hours/month. Could be additional time if there is a work party scheduled.

The **Facilities Commission** is a consultative body which provides the parish with advice concerning the maintenance and upkeep of the parish facilities; with a comprehensive five-year plan addressing long-range care, upkeep and improvements to the facilities as well as needed capital improvements or additions; with organizational help through work parties, paint parties, and other projects.

Meetings are held on the fourth Thursday of the month at 6:30 p.m. (except July and August). A work party only option is available.
