A year has passed since we launched the Worldwide Synod Listening Sessions at Mary, Queen of Peace. Synod Extended through 2024

Many have already seen that <u>Pope Francis extended the Synod on Synodality through 2024</u>. Bishops will meet in Rome in both October of 2023 and October of 2024. Pope Francis's decision reflects his desire that the church discern the theme of synodality over a longer period. Also for the synod to be thought of as a process where (only by the grace of the Holy Spirit) the People of God walk together toward the Lord's will for His Church. Certainly, the prayerful dialogue of the diocesan phase has created some energy, excitement, and shared vision of a Church that journeys together.

Synod Continental Stage

A new stage of the Synod means a new working document for the People of God to prayerfully read, reflect, listen, and dialogue on. The Continental Working Document, available in both <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u>, is a synthesis of all national reports and includes citations from local churches across the globe. The reader benefits from having participated during the diocesan phase, but this is encouraged reading for all as it is the basis for continental assembly dialogue.
