

MINISTRY EXPECTATIONS

How do I become a member of the Senior League Crew? Indicate an interest in the ministry on the Stewardship of Talent card; or you may contact the parish office or the ministry leader, directly.

What defines an "active crew member"? Regular participation at the monthly (Sept.-June) mid-day gatherings.

How do I end my ministry? Notify the parish office or the ministry coordinator.

What special talents/characteristics are desired in a crew member? A desire to attend and help; parish membership is not a requirement.

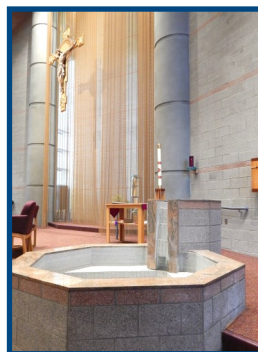
What is the time commitment? If you are able to help with set-up, picking-up and or clean-up, the commitment is 3-4 hours per month, Sept.-June.
